Hebrews 3:1-6

¹ Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, ² who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God's house. ³ For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself. ⁴ (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) ⁵ Now Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, ⁶ but Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

Discussion Questions

Is there a time where something you made fell apart?
Why did it fall apart?
Was it ever because it was based on a faulty plan?

Look at those two words in verse 1, 'consider Jesus.'
What do you think the author means by that?
Why is he/she writing it?
Do we take the time to 'consider Jesus'?

What do you think of Moses?
How do you think that compares with how Jewish people looked/look at Moses?
Was verse 3 a shocking thing to say to Christians in the early church?

Does it seem obvious that Jesus should hold a higher place than anyone else or that the Gospel hold a higher place than any other idea?
Why or why not?

Is there the danger today to place people, ideas, or actions above the superiority of Jesus Christ?
What is the antidote to letting this happen?
How can we examine our foundation individually and as a church?
